Marc, Since I am currently employed by the FBI, you will have to make the request to the FBI Director. I am currently in a situation in which the FBI pulled my security clearance in April due to my pending termination. However, a Deputy A.G. recently reversed the FBI's efforts to fire me and I am to return to duty on December 18th. The Deputy A.G. wrote in his findings the FBI would have the final say on my security clearance. If I don't get it back, I am done. They wanted to fire me for speaking out publicly in June 2003, about the FBI's terrorism failures prior to 9/11 and afterwards.

From August 2003 to December 2003, I was assigned to a TDY assignment at FBIHQ working on highly classified matters. Again from January 3, 2005 through April 21, 2005, I was assigned to a TDY assignment at the new Anti-Terrorism Center working on highly classified matters. There were no problems or questions regarding my security clearance prior to April 21, 2005. Now the FBI is in a position to retaliate against me by denying my security clearance. Just the type of thing you are looking into.

After all I have been through trying to tell the truth through the proper channels, my recommendation to any government employee is this, "No matter what you see, even the death of another as a result of the incompetence or negligence of any manager, KEEP YOUR MOUTH SHUT!" I know that sounds bad, but that is my recommendation.
