After 9/11, Robert and I could remain silent no longer, we were compelled to go public ONLY by the motivation to save lives. We needed to try and tell Congress that there was something amiss within the FBI. The FBI was not doing all in its power to prevent terrorism. In an attempt to IMPROVE the FBI and try to INSURE that another 9/11 would not occur we told our story on ABC's Prime Time Thursday. Since then the FBI has had a vendetta against agent Wright. Agent Wright had committed the grievous sin of telling the truth about the FBI's inefficiencies in the war on terrorism which he did ONLY because the FBI refused to listen. Robert Wright is one of the most hard working, conscientious and knowledgeable agents the FBI has regarding terrorism, but what does the FBI do to this experienced agent, they CONSPIRE to fire him at a time when the United States needs him the most. The FBI is more interested in retaliating against one of its own than it is in fighting terrorism. Only you and members of Congress can keep his firing from occurring.
